Moments Matter - Attendance Counts

From the first day of term to the last, the small moments in a school day make a real difference to your child #AttendanceCounts.

I am certain that you will have seen the recent news around attendance.

As I'm sure you are aware, the attendance here at Broomhill Infant School is below the national average and is something that the Ofsted inspector has named as an area for improvement.

As such, I would like to draw your attention to some of the more recent information below, and appeal to our parents and carers to carefully consider the impact of taking your child out of school during term time. A prolonged period of absence is likely to heighten a child's anxiety about attending school in the future.

The NHS and the Chief Medical Officer say it is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their child / children to school with mild respiratory illnesses, including general cold symptoms like a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat.
